

## Musical Horizons: Curriculum Important to Lives of Homeless Children



Jeanne Rintell, one of Brookline Music School's early childhood teachers, recently gained national attention for her work with *Musical Horizons*, Brookline Music School's collaboration with Horizons for Homeless Children. She was asked by Horizons to present a workshop on the *Musical Horizons* curriculum at the 2nd Young Children Without Homes National Conference, in Boston in May, 2007. Attendees included 570 participants from 30 states and Canada to focus efforts on improving the lives of young homeless children. Featured speakers included Marian Wright Edelman of the Children's Defense Fund, Dr. T. Berry Brazelton of the Touchpoints Center at Boston Children's Hospital and Dr. Jack Shonkoff of The Center on the Developing Child at Harvard University. Following the workshop, Jeanne was overwhelmed with requests for information about *Musical Horizons*, indicating a widespread need for this kind of curriculum.

The *Musical Horizons* program enables 150 homeless children aged 2-5 years to actively participate in weekly music and movement classes for 40 weeks per year, while their parents attend job training and other services to help them break the cycle of homelessness. The classes are taught at Horizons for Homeless Children's sites in Dorchester, Jamaica Plain and Roxbury. In addition to support from Brookline Music School's Annual Fund, this program is also made possible by a grant from the Edith Glick Shoolman Foundation.

## 2008 Spring Beatles Concert - The White Album

In May of this year, we celebrated The Beatles by performing their *Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band* album at Northeastern University. The concerts were a huge success - but what a tough act to follow! For several months, we have been deliberating on the musical theme for our May 2008 concert, also to be held at Northeastern. Nothing seemed to be as exciting or as obvious to us and, finally, we faced a truth: The Beatles were amazing musicians and songwriters and they produced two more great albums in 1968 and 1969. So, next May we will perform the second in our Beatles trilogy - our own abridged version of *The White Album*, which culls the best songs from the two-album set. At least, we think we've culled the best! Please mark your calendars - May 10th and 11th, Northeastern University's Blackman Theatre - and judge for yourselves!

The Sgt Pepper concert was the brainchild of John Purcell, our Jazz/Rock ensembles coordinator, and he had this to say about *The White Album*:

"The Beatles evolved with remarkable speed. Released just eighteen months after Sgt. Pepper (with Magical Mystery Tour in between) *The White Album* cast their music in an entirely different light. The fractures that would soon break the group apart are much in evidence. Many tracks show little sign of collaboration, and producer George Martin's absence from the helm resulted in excesses of every sort. Ultimately though, none of this really matters. At the height of their powers, Lennon and McCartney seemed incapable of writing bad songs, and *The White Album* effortlessly transcends its troubled origins. To many, this is the most evocative and personal of all Beatle albums."

## Summer in Brookline



### Drums, Dancing and More

Last July, the place to be in the late afternoons was the Brookline Housing Authority playground, serving the Egmont and Trustman apartments. Nearly 50 children and teens ages 6 to 16 learned to sing, dance and play the drums in Brookline Music School's partnership with BHA and Steps to Success, an educational achievement program providing academic, social development and family support services to low-income students and their families. The Summer Sizzle program offered a Hip Hop class, a Voice Jam, and a Drumming Circle using African and Latin American hand drums. And what did the kids think? "I like the drums, it's the best instrument." "I feel talented!" "I sound musical, and feel like a star!"

The Summer Sizzle program was made possible through a grant from the Brookline Community Foundation. We are looking forward to future collaborations with the Brookline Housing Authority and Steps to Success.



### Meet the Instruments

The summer kicked off with our popular one-week program, Meet The Instruments! This year's enrollment reached an all-time high with 40 children, ages 6 to 9 years. Each day, the children explored different musical instruments, including string, winds, brass, percussion instruments and piano. Our talented teachers, (*Rodrigo Bonelli, Irina Chirkova, Betsy Hinkle, Julianne Johnston, Russell Jewell, Scott Pittman, Cynthia Sanger*) with the help of Meet The Instruments Coordinator, Ivey Johnston, made this a week the children will not soon forget!

### Music & More

A total of 63 children, ages 4 to 8 years, participated in last summer's Music & More Program. Under the direction of Teri Boucher, who has organized the program for the past eight years, staff (*Ivey Johnston, Callista Perry, Jessica Wight and Ben Weissman*) and faculty (*Julianne Johnston, Nancy Knight, Jeanne Rintell, Margaux Skalecki, Chrissie Smith, Dayse Weissman*) led the children in singing, dancing, musical instrument exploration, and arts and crafts. During the final class, families were invited to join in the fun as their children performed songs and dances they'd learned during the program.

# In Memory of Sandra von Lichtenberg

1928-2007

Sandra von Lichtenberg, a member of Brookline Music School's Board of Directors for forty years, passed away April 20, 2007. A warm and dynamic community activist, she was the wife of Dr. Franz von Lichtenberg, a mother of six and school librarian in Needham for many years. Sandy's wise and measured counsel helped our School grow and become the dynamic cultural institution it is today. Originally founded by Brookline Public Schools, the School was incorporated in 1967 as a private, nonprofit institution, largely because of Sandy's initiative. Over the years, Sandy's guidance helped the School move into its permanent home on Kennard Road and develop a diverse range of programs for students of all ages and abilities. Sandy will always be a huge presence in the hearts and minds of all of us at the School and we will miss her very much.
